How much chocolate will each person get if 3 people share 1/2 lb of chocolate equally? How many 3/4-cup servings are in 2/3 of a cup of yogurt? How wide is a rectangular strip of land with length 3/4 m in and area 1/2 square mi? Compute fluently with multi-digit numbers and find common factors and multiples.
